The training team at CFA is excited to offer externs the option to choose from three advanced clinical tracks: Child and Adolescent Psychotherapy, Psychological Assessment, and School Consultation.

### **About The Externship**

CFA externs will join our team for two days a week for a total of 16 hours. The majority of responsibilities at CFA are conducted in person. We are particularly interested in candidates who are eager to learn about group practices and child and family work, and demonstrate personal attributes such as camaraderie, compassion, intellectual curiosity, and commitment to premier care. Our theoretical orientation is primarily cognitive-behavioral, and externs will have the opportunity to learn about and integrate multiple evidence-based approaches rooted in Dialectical-Behavioral, Psychodynamic, ACT and Somatic theories, among others.

### **Supervision:**

Externs will receive at least one, and up to two hours of individual supervision and one small-sized group supervision meeting per week. Your primary supervisor will be a Licensed Clinical Psychologist. The group supervision meetings will have a "seminar component," where different professional development topics will be addressed. Topic themes include CFA core values, General Principles of the APA Ethics Code, Diversity and Inclusion, and Internship Interviewing.

### **Didactics:**

Externs will benefit from in-house trainings offered by CFA staff and other local experts, on average twice a month. Additionally, externs will have the option of preparing and presenting a case of their choice on two occasions over the course of the academic year.

### **Evaluations:**

At CFA, the extern's evaluation process is a collaborative endeavor. In addition to any agreement signed with the University Program, externs will set their own training goals at the onset of supervision. Evaluations will occur every trimester, and will assess both for student performance and satisfaction around training goals.

#### Tracks:

In the **Child and Adolescent Track**, the extern's clinical time will be entirely devoted to psychotherapy. A typical caseload may include eight weekly outpatient contact hours, mostly or exclusively (depending on interest) with children and adolescents. Therapy setting may include individual, family and/or group psychotherapy as well as parent guidance work.

Externs who choose the **Psychological Assessment Track** will carry around half a caseload of psychotherapy patients, and complete at minimum three psychological assessments over the course of their externship, mostly for children and adolescents. Referrals include diagnosis of learning differences, ADHD, Autism Spectrum, and mood, anxiety and eating disorders.

Externs in the **School Consultation Track** will carry a tailored clinical caseload that requires a variety of school interventions, including consultation for 504 and IEP meetings and collaboration with school staff on classroom-appropriate interventions to support clients' socioemotional growth. Externs may be eligible to shadow one or more of CFA's School Refusal and Collaborative School Partners evaluations.
