



Externship Position

Your Neighborhood Clinic is a not for profit community mental health agency. We specialize in providing culturally competent mental health services to the under and uninsured. All trainees receive supervision from a licensed clinical psychologist.

The therapy extern should have completed at least 1 year of coursework. The position begins in September and ends in June. The extern will strengthen their ability to utilize evidence-based and evidence informed practice. Trainees will also have robust supervision experiences that includes direct observation.

Training Activities include:

Therapy Experience: Extern will carry a minimum of six therapy cases during the training period and will receive 1 hour of supervision per week. Supervision is included for all clinical activities.

Didactic Seminar: Extern have the opportunity to attend a wide variety of seminars on topics including cultural competency, psychological assessment, and evidence-based theories. Didactic seminars will occur once a month.

Supervision: Individual Supervision will be scheduled for Friday mornings. Trainees must be available for at least 8-12 hours/week. Extern may have the opportunity to supervise a predoctoral extern.

Professional Presentations: YNC is focused on improving community mental health throughout the Washington, DC area. Thus, each trainee will be required to present a mental health topic 2x out of the year (1 per semester).

Assessment: Psychological assessments are an aspect of this site. If externs have completed their assessment courses, they will complete 5 assessments while training. Assessments are ADHD evaluation and include the WAIS. Externs must have previous WAIS administration experience. They will receive training on the remaining measures.

Group: Externs will co-lead a support group. Each extern will work with the director to discuss, develop, and implement a support group for a specific population or issue that is relevant to extern and the mission of YNC.

Externs should be committed to learning and working to improve mental health in communities and individuals. We will accept three externs.

Post Doctoral Position

The Post Doctoral Resident should have completed their PhD. or PsyD. in Counseling or Clinical Psychology. We have an open enrollment for post doc to accommodate individuals who may graduate in December. The postdoc will strengthen their ability to utilize evidence-based and evidence informed practice. Trainees will also have robust supervision experiences that includes direct observation. This is a perfect opportunity for anyone interested in learning about running a private practice, working with diverse clients, and developing their professional identity. Pay is \$45,000 for 12 months appointment.

Training Activities include:

Therapy Experience: Post Doc will carry a maximum of 20 therapy cases during the training period and will receive 1 hour of supervision per week. Supervision is included for all clinical activities.

Didactic Seminar: Post Doc have the opportunity to attend a wide variety of seminars on topics including cultural competency, psychological assessment, and evidence-based theories. Didactic seminars will occur once a month.

Assessments: Post Doc will complete at least 2 assessments per month. These assessments will include ADHD, Cognitive, and Personality measures.

Supervision: Individual Supervision will be scheduled for Friday afternoons or Wednesday mornings. Trainees must be available for at least 30-35 hours/week. Post Doc may have the opportunity to supervise a predoctoral extern.

Professional Presentations: YNC is focused on improving community mental health throughout the Washington, DC area. Thus, each trainee will be required to present a mental health topic 2x out of the year (1 per semester).
